While in federal service, Mr. Hall received the Director's Award for Superior Performance, numerous Special Act Awards, and other awards and commendations from government agencies, including the FBI, CIA, DEA, and ATF.

David will be discussing his personal experiences that inspired the book at a launch event hosted in the New York City office of Wiggin and Dana on October 19th. The release of David's book is timely in the face of recent news of increased Chinese sanctions.
